We also had a couple sensory bins that reflected this bug inquiry as well. This included a honey collection water bin, a bubble bin and a new STEM water and oil bin. We've also brought in new library books highlighting bugs, trucks and kindness. Our come as you want art offered a number of open ended bug activities and materials. Our favourites this month were; butterfly paint symmetry, pom pom stamp caterpillars, loose parts and bee paintings! Lastly a nature loose part caterpillar group project was created and is on display in our hallway. Since the "school year" is coming to an end, we are celebrating with fun days! We had a turtle visit, we will enjoy some slime making, water days, and a teddy bear picnic! This month we will be celebrating Mhairi's birthday. We will be welcoming Oscar, Augustyn, Henry, Emery and Ada into room 5, and will be saying bye for now to Matthew, Nathan and Aubrey.
